Professor Markandu Thirukumar

Professor Markandu Thirukumar, a proud alumnus of Jaffna Central College, is a distinguished academic and clinician in the field of Obstetrics and Gynaecology. Born and raised in Urumpirai, he received his primary education at Urumpirai Chanthirothaya Vidyasalai and completed his secondary education at Jaffna Central College, where he excelled in academics and demonstrated strong leadership abilities.

He entered the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Jaffna and graduated with an MBBS degree with honors. Driven by a deep passion for women's health and medical education, he specialized in Obstetrics and Gynaecology. He went on to obtain his MD from the Postgraduate Institute of Medicine, University of Colombo, and later completed advanced clinical training at the National Women's Hospital in Auckland, New Zealand.

Currently, Professor Thirukumar serves as a Professor of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at the Faculty of Health-Care Sciences, Eastern University, and as an Honorary Consultant Obstetrician and Gynaecologist at the Teaching Hospital in Batticaloa, Sri Lanka. Renowned for his excellence in teaching, he plays a vital role in educating both undergraduate and postgraduate medical students, contributing significantly to curriculum development, clinical training, and examiner responsibilities at multiple institutions. He is also a key contributor to research in maternal health, with several publications and conference presentations to his name.

A passionate advocate for maternal safety, Professor Thirukumar has led numerous national and regional training programs in emergency obstetric care. He has pioneered simulation-based training for healthcare providers, particularly in resource-limited settings. His recent initiatives include workshops on communication skills for medical professionals and training programs for midwives aimed at enhancing maternal care in the region.

He is actively involved in public health outreach, quality improvement initiatives, and clinical audits to improve maternal health outcomes. As a dedicated mentor, he supports and guides many young professionals in their careers.

Professor Thirukumar is a strong proponent of community service and educational empowerment. Message from the President

As the President of Jaffna Central College Colombo Old Boys' Association (JCC – COBA), I am honored and privileged to pen this message to the booklet of JCC-COBA Annual General Meeting April 26th 2025.

It is an honor to be associated with an association established in 1913 with long heritage and history and it's a privilege to carry the baton passed by our predecessors who have taken this association to where it is today.

Colombo OBA had been providing Thought Leadership for the college development. I'm pleased to pen down Key initiatives, Pioneering projects and Long-term projects undertaken by COBA.

Key initiatives

- 1. Membership drive & Succession planning It is imperative for the Exco to have members with specific skill sets to support the long-term projects undertaken by the Exco. A mix of young talent and men with experience and wisdom in our Exco would ensure, we have an effective succession plan to take up leadership positions and carry on the baton passed on by our predecessors. Exco members need to allocate two hours monthly on third Saturday to attend Exco meetings and commit approximately two to three hours per month to do their assignments in the sub committees. If work is shared among all members, there will be less burden on a few who had to shoulder the work. Allocation of work evenly will encourage more old boys to join the Exco. We have been successful in scouting a few old boys with specific skill sets to support our skill lab project as well as undergraduates who are recipients of our scholarship program to our Exco.
- 2. **Zoom license to facilitate Hybrid meetings** We have hybrid (In person & Virtual) Exco meetings which helps Exco to source membership in any part of the Globe where members of COBA who are passionate to support the specific projects can join the Exco to contribute and join the meetings via Zoom. We have currently participants from Jaffna and Quarter and expect a member from Canada to join as well. Zoom meetings also help Exco members residing in Colombo to join virtually in case of tight family commitments ensuring broader participation of Exco members.
- 3. **Constitutional Amendments** We are proposing constitutional amendments to be adopted in 2025 AGM, for Exco to function efficiently in modern times. For more details refer Constitutional Sub Committee report.

Pioneering Projects

1. Scholarship for bright and needy AL and University students. Colombo OBA was the first to offer scholarships to the students. Program commenced in 2001 by establishing a Scholarship Trust which had been financially supported by Canada OBA, Sydney OBA and London OBA as well as many old boys from across the globe. These donations bears testimony of Colombo OBA's professionalism in handling finances in a trustworthy and transparent manner. Funding is placed in

a fixed deposit and interest earned is disbursed to the bright and needy AL and undergraduate students. Since the establishment of the Scholarship Trust, 587 AL students and Undergraduates have benefitted from the program. For more details refer Scholarship Report.

2. **Nutritional Program for Sportsmen** - Colombo OBA pioneered and commenced the nutritional program in 2015 providing nutritional supplement for cricketers on the day of the practice and later expanded to the soccer players.

Long Term Projects

- 1. Wholistic Resource Management Project (WRMP)—This is an initiative commenced by Colombo OBA in November 2022 and have progressed well over three transitions in College Administration. WRMP proposal was accepted by the then Principal Dr.Elilvendhan, implemented during the time of Principal Mr.S.Indrakumar and is now endorsed to be a vital tool for the much needed donations and to be continued by the Principal Mrs.Selvagunalan supported by the school Management & Development Committee. All the OBA's have expressed their gratitude to Colombo OBA for having initiated this project and commended the principal for allowing J A Partners to conduct independent audit which is helping them to solicit donations for the development of the college. At the request of the Colombo OBA, college is now in the process of obtaining Ministry of Education approval to install a donor management software to improve efficiency, transparency and accountability for the donations received and to provide timely and accurate reports to the donors. - 2. **Skills Lab** Colombo OBA has successfully established a Skills Lab at college. Skills Lab creates a well-structured career path for all students of JCC with the aid of advanced diagnostic tools to identify the students talent at an early stage (grade 9) and structure a career path with the support of the college administration, student's parents, Ministry of Education to set up the first ever Skills Lab in Sri Lanka for this purpose, Department of Education, Career Guidance unit facilitation, Industrial Development Board to set up Student Entrepreneurship Circle, Vocational Development Authority to award Internationally recognized certification in chosen fields as per career diagnostic results of the student and Center for Children's Happiness Technical guidance and coordination will enable all students to find suitable paid internships while attending the program, and placed in well-paid jobs when completing the program and possibly finding skilled migrating opportunities overseas. All activities of COBA are captured in detail in the relevant subcommittee reports by the Chairmen of the sub committees in this booklet. I would like to thank all office bearers and committee members of Exco, College Principal and staff, donors and well-wishers for the support extended to execute the activities of Colombo OBA successfully

Wholistic Resource Management Project (WRMP)

Message from the Chairman - Thushy David (A.T.David)



As the Chairman and founder of the (WRMP), I am very pleased to pen this message to the booklet of JCC-COBA Annual General Meeting April 26th 2025. I would like to first acknowledge and thank the immediate Past President Mr. Victor Forman, COBA Exco 22/23 & 23/24, Former College Principals Dr.Elilvendan, Principal Mr.S.Indrakumar, and Present principal Mrs.Selvagunalan, College Staff, School Development Society, J.A Partners and Global OBA's for their support for this project to have succeeded thus far.

Birth of Wholistic Resource Management Project (WRMP) – A proposal titled Wholistic Resource Management Approach for Jaffna Central College was presented by self at the Exco meeting held on November 19th,2022 outlining a systematic approach of capturing comprehensive resource requirements of the college and sharing with all the OBAs of JCC spread across globally to fund college requirements in a sustainable, accountable and transparent manner by utilizing technology and smart sourcing combination for a pragmatic solution. When I presented the proposal to the Exco, I myself doubted the chances of this dream project being a reality, so was the Exco. However, Exco approved to proceed with the initiative and gave me a free hand.

Then COBA President Mr. Victor Forman didn't waste time and got an appointment for a meeting with the college then principal Dr. Elilvanthan on November 29th, 2022. Self and Mr. Victor Forman visited Jaffna with an offer letter titled Wholistic Resource Management offer to Jaffna Central College by Colombo OBA, highlighting the objective, benefits and the requirements we need from the college administration to commence the project and requesting the principal to countersign the offer and return a copy of our proposal if the offer is acceptable. Principal called the POG and shared the proposal and we discussed the practicality of implementation of the project. Principal was satisfied and countersigned the offer signifying acceptance of our proposal.

Wholistic Resource Management Project - Purpose of this project is to have a credible process to capture comprehensive requirements of the college from the college administration, sharing the requirements with all the OBA's, obtaining funding required from the OBA's directly into the School Development Society Account, provide acknowledgement to the donor immediately and have a process to update the donor of the status of utilization of funds by providing an expense report, project progress report, providing a by annual inventory inspection report for the equipment supplied. All the work relating to the process to be inspected by an independent audit firm based in Jaffna named J A Partners under a service agreement, for a fee to be borne by COBA. This project is successfully implemented since March 2023.

Wholistic Resource Management Process - utilizing technology (Google sheets) and smart sourcing.

Technology - Google Applications contain many tools, one of them being Google sheet which can be shared with multiple OBA's. When google sheet is updated by one OBA it can be viewed by all other OBA's in real time. Therefore, Google sheet facilitate all the OBAs to view the college requirements in real time as well as transparency which OBA has committed for a project and what are the projects available for sponsorship. If the value of a project is too high for one OBA

to handle, multiple OBA's can take part.

Smart Sourcing – Diverse skill set is required to handle Wholistic Resource Management Process. College administrative structure has limited capacity and OBAs will have annual election of office bearers so that sustainability of an OBA handling the work load is not a reality. Out sourcing the work to a credible independent professional firm under a service agreement with clear roles and responsibility ensures sustainability of work being carried out as desired. J A Partners, an audit firm based in Jaffna had been tasked with handling preparation of the expense report, project progress report and inventory inspection report to be shared with the donors.

Alignment of Global OBA's – When launching the WRMP, concept of WRMP had to be socialized with all the OBA's to ensure they understood the concept and are willing to wholeheartedly support the initiative. COBA had to have individual meetings with each of the OBA president & secretary and take them through the concept and obtained each OBA's consent to be part of WRMP. As the next step, we had to form a forum named Global OBA Presidents and Secretaries headed by the principal of the college, to unitedly to address the needs of the college as per WRMP. This is a historic milestone and a feather in the cap of all the OBA's being able to come together to achieve a common goal coordinated by Colombo OBA. Since forming of the Global OBA Presidents and Secretaries Forum, we have had 6 meetings headed by the principal. Colombo OBA being the coordinator, sets the agenda for the meeting in consultation with the principal, drives the meeting, take minutes and follow up on the action items agreed to ensure execution of the WRMP. Meeting minutes are adopted at the next meeting for accuracy and then shared with the respective OBA's. At the request of the Principal, Edu Care and the Bus society were included to this forum due to their significant financial contribution for education and support service for sports respectively.

Global Stakeholder Forum – After the Principal Mrs.Selvagunalan took office in March 25, she included the school management in the Global Forum to create transparency within the school management and the donor community and added Jaffna OBA and the Centralities Sports Club to create a comprehensive college community and donor forum. Name of the forum was appropriately changed to Global Stakeholder Forum. To create sustainability for the coordination of the Global forum it was suggested at the Colombo OBA Exco meeting that the current coordinator and President of the Colombo OBA will remain as the coordinator of the Global Stakeholder forum and a Deputy coordinator to be chosen from another OBA on the same basis whether they hold office in their respective OBA or not they will remain the Deputy coordinator. Proposal was tabled at the Global Forum meeting held on Feb 25. Proposal was accepted and London OBA President was unanimously elected as the Deputy coordinator. We expect the first meeting of the Global Stakeholder Forum to take place in the month of May 25.

Global OBA Code of Conduct, Ethics & Governance Structure – We had to form a value system, ethical practices and a governance structure to promote unity and uniformity in the way all the OBA's function. First version of this document was adopted unanimously by COBA Exo at the first Exco meeting of the current office bearers held on March 25th 2023 and shared with all the OBA's for adoption. Amended second version of the document was approved and adopted unanimously by the COBA Exco on March 16th, 2024 and adopted as a resolution at the AGM held on April 6th, 2024

Current status of WRMP – Comprehensive college requirements were captured in Google Sheets with categorization of urgent needs and requirements that are to be met after urgent needs are met. OBA's have already taken up projects that are within their financial means. College principal

had been active in soliciting support from various batches, old boys and well-wishes in meeting some of the needs that were not met by the OBA's. An inventory inspection was carried out by J A Partners in October 24.

Quarterly reports are prepared by J A Partners for the donations received donor wise and purpose wise and funds utilization report purpose wise with donor balances left any. Quarterly reports are shared with the OBA's 2 weeks before the Global Forum meetings to give sufficient lead time for the OBA's to review their own contributions and revert if there are any omissions to highlight. This process had been in place since March 2023 and reports had been accurate thus far.

Future Plans - Installation of Donor Management Software

On October 1st, 2024, President of the Colombo OBA had a progress review meeting with the College Treasurer, Teacher in charge for accepting equipment to the college and the principal. A request was made from the college administration on the possibility of automation of donor management to improve efficiency, accuracy and to save precious time spent on the process by college administration.

A vendor based in Jaffna who has experience in developing donor management system has been chosen by Colombo OBA for the development, training and help capture data from March 2023 in the system and ensure support during the initial period. Software will be developed at a cost of Rs.500,000.00 with a fixed cost of Rs.36,000.00 p.a. for web and a maintenance fee of Rs.50,000.00 p.a. David's family (3 sons and 2 daughters of late Mr.A.M.David) have come forward to fund the software development cost through the Colombo OBA in memory of their late father Mr.A.M.David, an English teacher and POG at JCC during 1972 to 1984. Colombo OBA will pick the fixed cost of Rs.36,000.00. Proposal was made to the Global forum to share the maintenance cost of Rs.50,000.00 p.a. and the fee of J A Partners Rs.120,000.00 p.a. as a mark of solidarity and ownership of the project. Some OBA's have responded positively while with the others, its being put forward to their respective Exco's for Approval.

Since this is a high cost project Colombo OBA approved the donor management project on the condition that College Management, School Development Society and the Ministry of Education approves the installation of software and commitment from the college to utilize the software to ensure the implementation of this project is successful and sustained through the transitions in college administration. College is in the process of obtaining these approvals.

Donor Management System overview

It's a web-based system which could be accessed by anyone from any part of the globe. System will show all the funding requirements of the college. If a donor is interested in a particular project, he can choose the project he wishes to contribute. When choosing a project, system will require the donor to do a self-registration by providing the donors name, address, mobile no and e mail address. Once the self-registration is done, system will allow limited access to the project by indicating the amount of donations already contributed towards the project. Donor can contribute an amount he wishes by making a payment directly to the School Development Society account. College administration will receive an alert of the donation from the system. College administration will validate the receipt of funds by checking the bank account on line and will acknowledge receipt once the funds are received. Once college acknowledge receipt of funds, donor will have live access to that project indicating the amount of donations received

and the amount of funds disbursed at that point in time. Every 15th of the month J A Partners will inspect and verify the expenses to ensure independent verification and accuracy of the data in the system in relation to the expenses. Once the project is completed, after J A Partners verification, all the donors of that project will receive a detailed expense report and a project progress report by e mail.

Benefits of the system

1. Transparency

- a. Potential donors can view the total amount required for the project and the donations already received and how much more is required.
- b. Donors are able to view the disbursements made under the project and project progress live in the system
- c. On completion of the project all the donors will receive an e mail with an expense report and project progress report after inspection and approval of Audit Firm J A Partners
- d. All donations of goods Smart Boards, photo copiers etc are verified by an annual inventory inspection by J A Partners and a report submitted to the donors with the status of warranty and service agreement expiry
- 2. Accountability Audit by an independent professional audit firm J A Partners based in Jaffna
- 3. Access worldwide Software is web based and could be accessed by Old boys of JCC, Various batches of JCC, All the OBA's worldwide and well-wishers who wish to support the college development
- 4. Improved donations Given the worldwide accessibility, transparency and accountability donors will feel comfortable to donate for college development

In conclusion, I hope installation of the software, utilization of it by college administration together with unanimous alignment of Global Stakeholder Forum members supporting the vision of the principal to develop the college can accelerate development of the college.

Project: Skills Lab for Employability and Entrepreneurship Development

1. Introduction

The Education Committee of the Colombo Old Boys Association of Jaffna Central College has initiated a visionary project to establish a Skills Lab at Jaffna Central College, with the overarching goal of enhancing employability and career readiness among its students. Endorsed at the 2024 COBA Annual General Meeting with the proposal of Mr Amithanayakam, the Skills

Lab aims to provide students—especially those aged 14 to 16, and school leavers—with career guidance, vocational training, exposure to industry pathways, and mentorship.


By 2030, COBA aspires for every Jaffna Central College graduate to secure meaningful employment or be well-positioned in entrepreneurial ventures, regardless of their socio-economic background or academic track. This annual progress report outlines key activities, milestones achieved, partnerships formed, and outcomes recorded as part of the initial phase of this strategic initiative. The skill lab initiative was introduced to whole school on 1.10.2024.











2. Key Developments of Skills Lab with School Management

- An orientation meeting was successfully held with the Principal and School Management Team, where the objectives, structure, and long-term impact of the Skills Lab were introduced.
- The school administration responded positively and extended its full support.
 The Vice Principal was appointed as the official focal point, supported by the Sectional Head and two designated teachers.



• A mutually agreed Venue was allocated within the school, and a formal Offer Letter was signed, symbolizing a strong institutional commitment toward the Skills Lab's development and operation.

3. Career Education Program and Student Engagement Activities

 Career Orientation and Assessment Program was conducted for 135 students, helping them explore their strengths, interests, and career paths through professional tools and guided reflection.

- Career voting was introduced to the grade 9 students to aware their career choices
- Monthly career guidance and skill development activities were conducted at the school for the grade 9 students. This has developed the insight of the students to focus on their career choic-











4. Career Development Camp

Outdoor Career Development Camp was held at Karisal Resort, engaging 59 students in interactive learning, career goal setting and team-building exercises facilitated by experienced career development professionals. The event created extreem interest in career and skill development among the students of grade 9.























5. Fundraising and Financial Progress

- A dedicated fundraising event was held in Colombo, with active participation from COBA members and supporters.
- The President of COBA successfully led efforts to secure the initial phase of funding required for infrastructure setup, resource development, and program delivery.
- A long-term fundraising campaign has been launched, targeting recurring and future financial needs with an emphasis on sustainability and donor engagement.

6. Development of Strategic Partnerships and External Stakeholder Network

A strong network of external stakeholders has been established to provide expertise, support, and delivery of future training programs. This includes:

- Department of Education, Career Guidance Unit.
- Vocational Training Authority of Sri Lanka
- Industrial Development Board North
- University of Jaffna Career Guidance Unit
- Skills Unit Center for Children's Happiness
- District Secretariat Human Resource Development Officers
- Sri Lanka German Technical Training Institute

These collaborations will help ensure that students have access to relevant qualifications, handson experiences, and eventual employment or apprenticeship opportunities.





7. Development of Content, Tools, and Curriculum

- A Technical Curriculum Development Team has been formed, comprising experts in career guidance, vocational training, and educational content creation.
- The team has designed a foundational curriculum covering:
 - Employability Skills (communication, digital literacy, teamwork, critical thinking)
 - Career Readiness (interview prep, resume writing, goal setting)
 - Vocational Pathways (sector-specific exposure in IT, mechanical, design, services, etc.)
- Tools for career assessment and program evaluation have also been developed to track individual student progress and overall program impact.

8. Course Planning and Infrastructure

- The infrastructure planning for the Skills Lab has been initiated with provisions for:
 - A career resource corner
 - Interactive learning spaces



Constitutional Amendments Sub Committee

Message from the Chairman - Thushy David (A.T.David)



As the Chairman of the Constitutional Amendments subcommittee, I am pleased to pen this message to the booklet of JCC-COBA Annual General Meeting April 26th 2025.

I would like to first acknowledge and thank all the Exco members, including the Vice Patrons for their time and valuable input for the proposal for amendments as well as the two lawyers and Colombo OBA members Mr.Prabaharan and Mr.Gnasekeram for their support for the legal review of the amendments.

Two of the main reasons for considering the constitutional amendments were

- 1. We have Colombo OBA members based in Jaffna working on our nutritional program and Skill Lab projects as well as some members living overseas passionate to support the Colombo OBA's projects. Obviously its not practical for them to be physically present at the Exco meetings but they could effectively contribute via Virtual means. Hence, we wanted virtual presence to be counted for quorum for Exco / AGMs.
- 2. We had bad experience in the past where members are elected to the Executive Committee not knowing their responsibility and commitments where some members did not show up even for one Exco meeting. Colombo OBAs involvement in long term projects requires committed persons with the right skill sets are selected and elected through a democratic process to the Executive Committee. Therefore, the Exco decided to follow the practice of professional associations where nominations are called for the office bearers and committee members by notice to the members well ahead of AGM. Persons wishing to be in the Exco have to fill in nomination forms supported by two members and the nominees undertaking to devote their time to serve the Exco. Members will be elected by the nominations committee based on the criteria set out by the Exco. This process is expected to have the right resources in the Exco where work is shared and efficiently executed.

Apart from the above key changes we had proposals adopting best practices which are included in the amendments and notice was sent as per constitution to all the members on April 5th, 2025.

Since 2001, one of the key initiatives of the Jaffna Central College Old Boys' Association – Colombo Branch has been the successful implementation of the Joint Scholarship Scheme, initiated through the Colombo Branch Trust. This scheme provides financial assistance to deserving, bright students of Jaffna Central College, enabling them to pursue their higher studies in Sri Lanka. Scholarships are awarded to students studying at the Advanced Level and University levels.

Financial assistance is disbursed twice a year, during the months of June/July and November/December. In 2024, each eligible University student received Rs. 18,000/- per year, while Advanced Level students received Rs. 15,000/- per year.

Applications for the scholarship are invited via newspaper advertisements, school notices, and announcements made by the Principal at school assemblies. Selection is carried out by the Scholarship Committee based on the following criteria:

- Academic performance in G.C.E. O/L and A/L examinations
- Family income
- Number of family members
- Physical disabilities (if any)
- Duration of study at Jaffna Central College
- Recommendations from the Principal and the Grama Sevaka
- All selections are made strictly on a merit basis.
