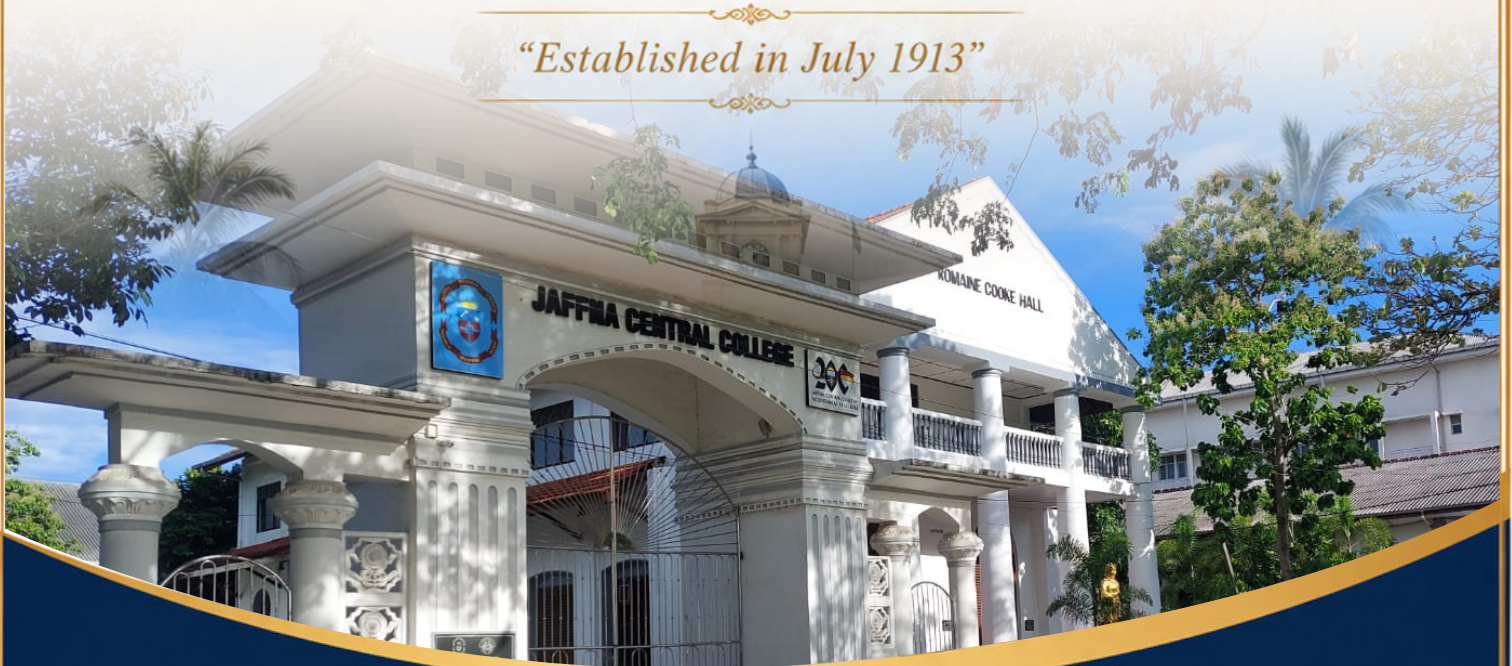

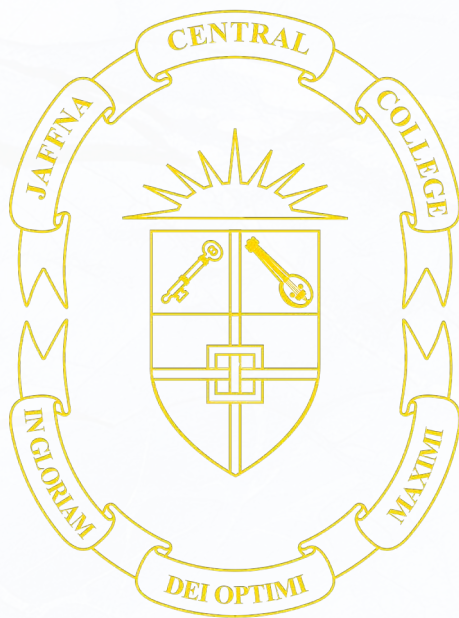



Mr. Kanaganayagam Kanag-Isvaran, is a President's Counsel , having taken Silk in January 1988. He is a Graduate in Law from the University of London, a Barrister-at-Law of Lincoln's Inn (1964) and an Advocate of the Supreme Court. of Sri Lanka.(1966).

He has an extensive practice on the civil side in both the original and appellate courts and specializes in several areas of law including, Corporate Law, Intellectual Property Law, Banking and Finance, Shipping and Admiralty, Telecommunication, I.T., and International Commercial Arbitration.

A Member of the Law Commission of Sri Lanka from 1994 till 2009, he Chaired the Committee which drafted the 'Mutual Assistance in Civil and Commercial Matters Act' No. 39 of 2000 and the 'Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Act', not enacted.

He led the team of Legal Experts who drafted the Arbitration Act No.11 of 1995. He also drafted the current 'High Court (Admiralty Jurisdiction) Rules 1991', at the invitation of the then Law Commission.

He was the Chairman of the Advisory Commission on Intellectual Property Law, and the Chairman of the Advisory Commission on Company Law, which drafted respectively the 'Intellectual Property Act No. 36 of 2003. and the Companies Act No.7 of 2007.

He is a Founder Director and Member of the Council of Management of the 'Institute for the Development of Commercial Law and Practice' (ICLP),and now the Chairman and a Founder Director of the ICLP 'Arbitration Centre', a Lecturer and Examiner for the Diploma Course in Arbitration, and the Certificate Course in Shipping Law and Practice, and other related courses conducted by the Centre.

He is the Chairman of the Board of Directors of The ICC-ICLP International ADR Centre (Guarantee) Ltd., incorporated in 2018 providing ADR services including Arbitration, Mediation and Negotiation and other ADR mechanisms.

He is a Trustee of the Sri Lanka National Trust, and was its President of the from 2018 to 2021.

He was a Visiting Lecturer at the Sri Lanka Law College, and is a Visiting Lecturer at the Faculty of Law, University of Colombo, lecturing on Advanced Company Law and Arbitration for the LLM Course of the Faculty of Law, University of Colombo.

He was a Member of the Faculty Board of the Faculty of Law, University of Colombo from 1990, since 2005, and a Member of the Council of the University of Colombo till 2015.

He holds several other positions of responsibility.

He has written extensively and lectured locally and abroad on several subjects, touching his area of practice and is a co-editor of "Arbitration Law in Sri Lanka" (3rd Ed. 2013) and the co-author of the "Company Law" (2014).

Message from the President

Thushy David (A.T.David)



As the President of Jaffna Central College Colombo Old Boys' Association (JCC – COBA), I am honored and privileged to pen this message to the booklet of JCC-COBA Annual General Meeting May 2nd, 2026.

It is an honor to be associated with an institution established in 1913 with long heritage and history and it's a privilege to carry the baton passed by our predecessors to serve as the President for the last 3 years.

As I took office in March 2023, my priority was to plan succession for a strong Executive Committee to carry out the projects implemented. I'm pleased to handover the baton to a capable successor supported by a strong Executive Committee to preserve the legacy and traditions of COBA.

COBA is fortunate to have a team of talented individuals dedicated to providing thought leadership and undertaking unique, long-term projects. For over 22 years, COBA has been a pioneer in offering scholarships to AL and university undergraduate students, benefiting more than 500 students. Additionally, the Nutrition Program, which has been operational for 14 years, has supported numerous sportsmen. Most recently, COBA has launched the Wholistic Resource Management Project, the Global Stakeholder Forum, and the Skills Lab, all of which require significant human resource engagement and ongoing funding.

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to the Executive Committees of the past three years, as well as to the principals—Dr. S.K. Elilvendan, Mr. S. Indrakumar, Mrs. C.R.S. Selvagunalan, and Mr. K. Senthilvadivelu—and the dedicated teachers and staff of JCC for their invaluable support in successfully executing our projects.

Below is a summary of the key initiatives and projects implemented over the last three years:

1. **Membership Drive and Succession Planning:** Our objective is to create a balanced Executive Committee (Exco) that includes a blend of young talent and experienced individuals who bring wisdom to our projects. Recently, a few university undergraduates, who are recipients of our scholarships, have joined the Exco, alongside carefully selected active and retired professionals from Sri Lanka and abroad.
2. **Hybrid Exco Meetings (In-Person and Virtual):** A Zoom license was acquired to enable Hybrid Exco meetings, enhancing participation from our members both in Sri Lanka and overseas. The meetings are recorded on Zoom, and the AI companion feature provides automatic summaries, easing accurate compilation of meeting minutes and follow up.
3. **Constitutional Amendments** -The constitution has been amended to enhance the effectiveness of the Executive Committee (Exco) in contemporary contexts. Key changes include:
 - a. **Virtual Participation:** Members can now participate virtually, which will count towards quorum and voting. This change acknowledges the importance of flexibility in today's digital age.
 - b. **Nomination Transparency:** The requirement to send nomination forms

along with the Annual General Meeting (AGM) notice has been introduced. This ensures that members who are nominated for the Exco are fully aware of their obligations and commitments.

- c. **Active Engagement:** These amendments aim to prevent situations where individuals are elected to the Exco without prior engagement or understanding of responsibilities, as seen previously with members who had not attended any meetings.

These constitutional amendments reflect our commitment to fostering a more engaged and accountable leadership within the organization.

4. **Engagement with Past Exco Members / Alumni** - We recognize the importance of maintaining connections with former Executive Committee (Exco) members and alumni. Many who leave the Exco express a strong desire to engage with current members, fostering fellowship and understanding of ongoing activities. In July 2025, we hosted a successful fellowship event with past Exco members following our regular Exco meeting. This initiative was well-received and highlights our commitment to nurture these relationships. We plan to hold similar events with increased frequency in the future, providing opportunities for collaboration, input, and the sharing of experiences between current and former members.
5. **Fund Raising:** To support the expanded activities of the COBA and enhance our engagement with the College, a multifaceted approach has been adopted to raise funds effectively. Below are some of the key initiatives:
 - a. **COBA Multipurpose Fund:** Initiated by Thushy David. This new fund was created to cover incremental expenses, including the Zoom License and fees for J.A. Partners, as well as to support any urgent requirements that may arise.
 - b. **David Family Sports Fund:** Initiated by Thushy David, established in memory of his late father Mr. A.M. David, a former English teacher and POG of JCC, existing fund of Rs.300,000 was increased by Rs. 500,000 taking the total funding to Rs.800,000.00.
 - c. **1979 Batch Fund:** Initiated by Thushy David through batch mates. This fund consists of two components: a donation of Rs. 1.6 million by Mr. K. Pushkar Karan from the UK to address the immediate needs of the College, and a fixed deposit of Rs. 950,000 to utilize the interest accrued for college needs.
 - d. **Membership Drive and Fundraising Event:** A membership drive and fundraising event was scheduled in August 2024 at the Grand Orient Hotel (GOH), aimed at membership drive, fund raising and fellowship amongst members.
 - e. **Scholarship Fund:** An incremental funding of Rs.3 Million to the Scholarship Fund was Initiated by Vice Patron Mr. S.S. Sivakumar, funded by Ms.Sumathy Sutharsan (USA) in memory of her distinguished old Centralite husband Mr.S.Sutharshan.
 - f. **Motivational Allowance :** Also initiated and funded by Vice Patron Mr. S.S. Sivakumar – A monthly motivational allowance of Rs 20,000/- was initiated

to Cricket Coach Mr Shelton from Jan to Mar'25.Total sum disbursed : 60,000/- .Same was converted as a monthly motivational allowance to Soccer Coach Mr Vignesh wef Apr'25.Total sum disbursed upto now,till May'26- 280,000/- .

- g. Dr. Ethirweerasingham Fund:** Initiated by Mr.Gerard David, this fund has a contribution of Rs. 500,000.00 in memory of Olympian late Dr.Ehirweerasingham. Interest of the funding to be utilized to purchase needy sports equipment.
 - h. Giving back to the community:** Mr.T.Vaseeharan, Vice President initiated and funded Rs.120,000.00 (monthly 10,000.00 for 12 months), to a Centralite University undergraduate perusing chartered accountancy
 - i. Skills Lab Fund:** Idea of Skills lab idea was mooted and funded by Mr. Amirthanayagam Rs. 500,000.00. Additional funding of Rs.750,000.00 was raised through a movie screening initiated by Mr.B.Raveendran.
 - j. Flood Relief Fund:** Initiated by Vice Patron Mr.S.S.Sivakumar. Total collection of Rs.883,228.51.In collaboration with the College Principal, fund was utilized to purchase 219 pairs of DSI shoes at a cost of Rs.659,224.44 Unutilized funds will be utilized for the needy students requirements in consultation with the principal.
- 6. Wholistic Resource Management Project - COBA** launched a project to comprehensively capture the resource requirements of the college across education, sports, and other curricular activities. This information was shared with the donor community (OBAs Globally) to secure funding. To ensure transparency and accountability, we appointed an independent firm J A Partners to verify the donations received and expenditures. This firm will submit a report that will be shared with donors, fostering confidence in our financial practices and enabling the college to utilize funds efficiently.
- 7. Global Stakeholder Forum:** The Global Stakeholder Forum has been established to promote alignment and coordination among the College administration, the Old Boys' Association (OBA) globally, and partner institutions, including Edu Care Trust, the Bus Society, and the Centralities Sports Club. The primary objective of the Forum is to ensure that contributions and initiatives benefiting the College are sustainable in the long term. By fostering collaboration among stakeholders, the Forum seeks to minimize redundant initiatives and promote efficient resource utilization across all projects and contributions. The Forum conducts quarterly meetings, coordinated by Mr. Thushy David and Deputy Coordinator Mr. K. Vijaishankar (UK) on an alternating basis. During these meetings, quarterly reports from J.A. Partners are shared for donors' review. Additionally, meeting minutes are disseminated among the Forum members, ensuring transparency and accountability. The minutes of the meetings are shared with the respective OBAs, which they can then communicate to their Executive Committees, fostering a comprehensive flow of information.

The principal serves as the head of the Global Stakeholder Forum, spearheading efforts to align priorities and ensure that collective actions effectively support the College's mission and goals.

8. **Skills Lab** – A proposal was made to the college by COBA on July 7, 2024 to establish a Skills Lab and was accepted by the principal. The initiative aims to provide a dedicated space within the school where students can access career guidance resources, mentoring opportunities, and skills development activities. An awareness program was conducted on October 1, 2024 and activities of the skills lab commenced shortly after the awareness program. The Skills Lab was officially opened on 10th March 2026, marking an important milestone in supporting students to explore their career pathways and develop essential employability skills. The event was held under the patronage of the Principal, with the participation of key stakeholders from the education sector and the Colombo Old Boys' Association (COBA). Highlight of the event was the presence of Eng. Amirthanayakam, who was instrumental in establishing the Skills Lab and the primary sponsor of the initiative, who travelled all the way from Colombo to attend the opening ceremony. His contribution and commitment to supporting the development of students at Jaffna Central College were warmly acknowledged by the school community. The event also saw the active participation of career guidance professionals from the Department of Education and the Jaffna District Secretariat, along with other stakeholders engaged in education and career development. Their presence reflected the growing importance of strengthening career guidance support within schools. Participants appreciated the efforts taken to establish the Skills Lab, recognizing it as the first model Skills Lab established within a school in Sri Lanka with the aim of systematically guiding students towards their career paths. Several speakers noted that such initiatives could contribute meaningfully to the newly proposed education reforms in Sri Lanka, which emphasize equipping students with practical skills, career awareness, and opportunities that support their transition from education to employment.

All activities of the College Old Boys' Association (COBA) are documented in detail within the relevant subcommittee reports presented by the Chairpersons in this booklet. I would like to extend my heartfelt gratitude to all the office bearers and committee members of the Executive Committee, the College Principal and staff, as well as our generous donors and well-wishers, for their invaluable support in successfully executing the initiatives of the Colombo OBA.

In closing, I would like to congratulate Mr.K.Senthilvadivelu on his appointment as the Acting Principal of our College. The Colombo OBA is committed to supporting the principal's vision for the continued development of our beloved alma mater.

As the Chairman and founder of the WRMP, I am pleased to share this message in the booklet for the JCC-COBA Annual General Meeting on May 2, 2026

First and foremost, I would like to extend my heartfelt gratitude to several key individuals and groups who have contributed to the success of this initiative. My sincere appreciation goes to our immediate Past President, Mr. Victor Forman, along with the COBA Executive Committee for the years 2022/23, 2023/24, 2024/ 25 & 2025/26. I would also like to recognize the contributions of our former College Principals: Dr. Elilvendan, Principal Mr. S. Indrakumar, Mrs. C.R.S.Selvagunalan, and our current Principal, Mr. K. Senthilvadivelu. Their leadership and vision have been instrumental in guiding our endeavors. Additionally, I want to thank the dedicated college staff, the School Development Society, our J.A. Partners, and the Global OBA community for their unwavering support of this project.

Project Purpose:

The purpose of the Wholistic Resource Management Project (WRMP) is to establish a credible and systematic approach to capture the comprehensive requirements of the college, as articulated by the college administration. Key objectives of the project include:

1. **Streamlined Funding Process:** Facilitate the direct transfer of funding from the OBAs to the School Development Society Account, ensuring transparency and efficiency.
2. **Acknowledgment of Donations:** Provide immediate acknowledgment to donors upon receipt of contributions to enhance donor relations and trust.
3. **Regular Reporting:** Keep donors informed about the utilization of their funds through:
 - Expense reports detailing how funds have been utilized.
 - Project progress reports outlining the status of funded initiatives.
 - Biannual inventory inspection reports for equipment supplied, ensuring accountability for resources.
4. **Independent Oversight:** All operations related to the project will be managed by J.A. Partners, an independent audit firm based in Jaffna, under a service agreement. The costs associated with this service will be covered by Colombo OBA, London OBA, Canada OBA and Sydney OBA.

This comprehensive approach not only secures the necessary funding for college development but also promotes transparency and accountability in the management of resources.

The WRMP has received widespread appreciation from JCC OBAs around the globe, as well as from the college administration, for being a valuable initiative that facilitates the sourcing of funding for college development. One of the key strengths of the WRMP is its collaboration with

J.A. Partners, an independent audit firm tasked with verifying donations and expenses. This process ensures transparency and allows for comprehensive reports to be shared with donors, thereby reinforcing trust and accountability.

In a demonstration of solidarity for this project, the London OBA, Canada OBA, and Sydney OBA have collectively stepped forward to cover the fees associated with J.A. Partners. Moreover, the college management has passed a resolution during the School Development Society meeting to continue supporting the WRMP, recognizing its critical role in securing essential funding for the college's development needs.

The backing from both global OBAs and the college management reinforces the sustainability and long-term viability of the WRMP, ensuring that we can continue our mission of supporting college development effectively.

Future Plans – Installation of Donor Management Software

The college administration has expressed a need for the automation of donor management to enhance efficiency, accuracy, and to conserve valuable time spent on administrative processes. To address this need, the Colombo OBA has selected a vendor based in Jaffna, experienced in developing donor management systems. This vendor will facilitate the software's development, provide training, and assist with data capture starting from March 2023, ensuring ongoing support during the initial implementation phase.

The total cost for the software development is estimated at Rs. 500,000.00, with a fixed annual fee of Rs. 36,000.00 for web hosting and an additional maintenance fee of Rs. 50,000.00 per year. The family of the late Mr. A.M. David, including his three sons and two daughters, has generously offered to cover the software development costs through the Colombo OBA in memory of their father, who served as an English teacher and Prefect of Games of JCC from 1972 to 1984. Additionally, the Colombo OBA has committed to covering the fixed annual cost of Rs. 36,000.00.

Given the project's significant financial implications, the Colombo OBA has approved the donor management project with the stipulation that the College Management, School Development Society, and the Ministry of Education must approve the installation of the software. Furthermore, it is crucial that the college commits to utilizing the software to ensure the project's successful implementation and sustainability through transitions in college administration. The college is currently in the process of obtaining the necessary approval from the Ministry of Education.

In conclusion, I am optimistic that the installation and effective utilization of the donor management software by the college administration, combined with the unanimous support of the Global Stakeholder Forum members for the principal's vision for college development, will significantly accelerate the college's progress. Together, we can drive meaningful change and enhance the quality of education provided to our students.

Develop Employability Skills and Enhance Career Potential among students at Jaffna Central

Project: Skills Lab for Employability and Entrepreneurship Development

1. Introduction

The Skills Lab initiative of the Colombo Old Boys' Association (COBA) continued its progress during 2025–2026 with a major milestone achieved through the official opening of the Skills Lab at Jaffna Central College on 10th March 2026.

The initiative, introduced by the Education Committee of COBA, was developed with the vision of creating a dedicated space within the school to support students in developing career awareness, employability skills, life skills, and future readiness. The long-term goal of the initiative is to ensure that every Central student is empowered to explore meaningful career pathways regardless of academic stream or socio-economic background. The foundational concept and progress of the initiative were established during 2024–2025 through career education activities, partnerships, curriculum planning, and infrastructure development.



2. Official Opening of the Skills Lab : A Milestone

The official opening of the Jaffna Central College Skills Lab was held on 10th March 2026 under the patronage of the Principal of Jaffna Central College, with the participation of key stakeholders from the education sector, career guidance field, alumni community, and partner institutions.

The opening ceremony marked a historic milestone, as the Skills Lab became one of the first school-based model spaces in Sri Lanka dedicated to structured career guidance, employability development, and future skills education within a school environment.

The Principal of Jaffna Central College highlighted that the Colombo Old Boys' Association had been working towards this initiative since 2024 and appreciated the commitment and continuity demonstrated by the Education Committee and the alumni community in reaching this milestone.

A special acknowledgment was extended to Eng. Amirthanayakam, the primary sponsor of the initiative, who travelled from Colombo to participate in the opening ceremony and continued to provide generous support for the development of the Skills Lab.

Stakeholder engagement

The opening ceremony was strengthened by the active participation of professionals and stakeholders connected to career guidance and student development.

It was emphasized that schools require structured systems to guide students towards informed career pathways and that the Skills Lab could serve as a practical model for future educational transformation initiatives.

3. Career Guidance and Student Development Activities (2025–2026)

During the year, the Skills Lab initiative continued to engage students through a series of career education and skill development activities.

These included:

- Career guidance sessions for Grade 9 students that included career orientation and career exploration activities and career interest identification exercises
- Leadership and teamwork activities
- Interactive learning and group engagement sessions
- Exposure to future career pathways and vocational opportunities

The programmes were designed to support students in:

- Understanding their strengths and interests
- Developing confidence and communication skills
- Building awareness of higher education and vocational pathways
- Exploring employability skills required for the future



The continuation of these activities helped strengthen the visibility and acceptance of the Skills Lab within the school community.

4. Future Directions

Following the successful opening of the Skills Lab, the Education Committee plans to further strengthen the initiative through:

- Expansion of career guidance programmes open to other students at school
- Development of mentorship systems involving JCC Old Boys
- Introduction of university and vocational pathway guidance sessions
- Digital learning and career information support through Learning Management System
- Collaboration with industries and training institutions for exposure
- Development of certification and short-term skills programmes



The Skills Lab is expected to continue evolving as a sustainable model that contributes towards preparing students for higher education, employment, entrepreneurship, and lifelong learning.

Conclusion

The year 2025–2026 marked a transformative phase for the Skills Lab initiative of COBA. What began as a vision and long-term engagement by career professionals and alumni has now become a functioning school-based model space dedicated to career development and employability education.

The official opening of the Skills Lab stands as one of the major highlights of the Education Committee during the year and reflects the collective commitment of the Jaffna Central College community towards supporting the future of its students.

Since 2001, one of the major initiatives of the Jaffna Central College Old Boys' Association – Colombo Branch has been the successful implementation of the Joint Scholarship Scheme through the Colombo Branch Trust. The scheme aims to provide financial assistance to deserving and academically talented students of Jaffna Central College, enabling them to pursue higher education in Sri Lanka.

Scholarships are awarded to students studying at both Advanced Level and University levels. Financial assistance is distributed twice annually, during June/July and November/December.

In 2025, each eligible University student received Rs. 18,000/- per year, while each eligible Advanced Level student received Rs. 15,000/- per year.

Applications for scholarships are invited through newspaper advertisements, school notices, and announcements made by the Principal during school assemblies. Selection of beneficiaries is carried out by the Scholarship Committee based on the following criteria:

- Academic performance in the G.C.E. Ordinary Level and Advanced Level examinations
- Family income
- Number of family members

- Physical disabilities, if any
- Duration of study at Jaffna Central College
- Recommendations from the Principal and the Grama Niladhari

All selections are made strictly on a merit basis.
